Keelboat Regatta Saturday 17th August 2019 NOTICE OF RACE

The organising authority is Bray Sailing Club (BSC), The Harbour, Bray, Co. Wicklow.

RULES:

The event will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of the Irish Sailing Association, the Progressive ECHO handicap system, the Sailing Instructions (SIs) and this notice of race.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Boats shall be entered by a member of a club or other organisation affiliated to a member of national authority of ISAF

Boats registered for club racing at BSC will use their current club handicap. All other boats must present an ECHO certificate or a written declaration from their club of the current handicap attributed to the boat.

The handicap committee will review all handicaps and may make adjustments based on available data. Non-BSC boats will start with their ECHO base handicap plus 10% or adjusted based on available data.

Entries are accepted on the basis that in no circumstances will any liability for injury to person(s) or property, or loss of property, attach to the Officers, Trustees, Committee, Race Committee, or Members of Bray Sailing Club.

The boat's owner or representative must sign a declaration on the Entry Form that his/her boat is covered by a policy of Third-Party Indemnity Insurance of not less than €3,000,000.

All competitors and race officials who are not members of Bray Sailing Club will be automatically members of the Club for the duration of the event and will be subject to the rules of the Club.

CLASSES:

Racing will be provided for Cruisers 1, 2 and 3, and Flying Fifteens. There may be separate starts for each class. Additional classes may be added at the discretion of the race committee.

REGISTRATION AND ENTRY FEE:

Registration of entries will take place in the Race Office, Bray Sailing Club on Saturday 17th Aug. between 09:15 and 10:15hrs, or on line at www.Braysailingclub.ie/PAYMENTS

The Entry Fee will be €25 per boat.

SCHEDULE OF RACES:

Up to three races are scheduled for Saturday 17th Aug.

The warning signal for the first race is scheduled to be at 11.15 hours on Saturday 17th Aug.

The schedule of races is subject to change.

COURSES:

Details of the courses to be sailed will be defined in a Notice to Competitors.

SCORING SYSTEM:

The races shall be scored as provided in Appendix A of the RRS (2017-2020) using the Low Points System. There will be no discards.

Series ties will be broken using the following in this order:

A8.1 (Most best scores)

A8.2 (Best score in last race)

Tie remains

PRIZES:

Prize giving will be held as soon as possible after racing on Saturday 17th Aug. using the following award structure:

Fleet Size	Award Structure
Less than 4 competitors	1 st prize only
4, 5 or 6 competitors	1 st and 2 nd prize
7 or more competitors	1 st , 2 nd and 3 rd prize

TIDES:

Bray Harbour dries out at low water. There is enough water at the slip for launching and retrieving boats for approximately 2.30 hours each side of high water, which is at 13.34 on the 17th August.
